- The meeting opened with a prayer.

- The children agreed to send out a questionnaire to the other pupils about how they feel about our school. They looked at the types of questions Ofsted might ask and decided on which questions they would like to ask. A simpler questionnaire will be sent to Key Stage 1 children. Mrs. Lewin will prepare this in time for the next meeting. We will decide at the next meeting whether to let children complete these in school or do them at home. Some of the school council think that it's more private to be able to do it at home, and some think we will get more in if we do them in school.

Any Other Business

- Someone said that our teachers give us extra activities so that we learn more.
- Children would like the 'wobbly log' to be fixed. Mrs. Lewin will sort this.
- There was a request to have more tennis equipment out at playtimes. Mrs. Lewin is to ask Mrs. Walton about this.
- The children would like more light footballs for playtimes & heavier ones for Class 3.
- There was a request for Class 3 to create an obstacle course for a sponsored activity, or to organise a sponsored run, or read.

- Finley had spotted where there is a fault in the security fence & it is creating a gap. He took the council outside to show where it was, & Mrs. Lewin will ensure it is fixed as quickly as possible.
- A mark on the buddy wall outside was pointed out from a pen - Mrs. Lewin will speak to the children in assembly about this.
