

The 2014-2015 Sport Premium funding for our school was £8,300.

Ways in which we have utilised our funding:

£5,000 was invested in the Easington School Sport Partnership Service Level Agreement.

- Coaches to deliver sessions in school time and after school clubs.

 - monitor the planning and delivery of PE in school
 - work with TAs to create a PE display in school

Impact of Initiatives

Following Young Leaders training, a group of children helped to set up and run an after school club for younger children using mini gym equipment.

Following input from a SSCo last year arranging a dance for a festival, a teacher devised a dance for her class to perform to parents. Sainsbury's School Games Silver Award was applied for and achieved.

A detailed record was kept of participation by children in tournaments, festivals and after school clubs showing an increased participation.

A PE team consisting of pupils from different classes as well as Young Leaders to keep pupils and parents informed through a newsletter and entrance wall display.

Assessing Impact

The school will continue to assess impact in some of the following ways

- Analysis of the development plan
- Organising support and lessons in line with easington SSCo activities.
- Progress towards sainsbury's School games Silver Award.
- Participation in after school clubs.
- Continued training of Young Leaders and an increase in numbers.
- Effective management of a sports apprentice.
- Registers of club membership and attendance of after school clubs and activities.
- A range of after school clubs offered including football, gymnastics, dance, athletics, rugby league and multi-skills
- Pupil feedback and meeting with the school PE team.
